Straw Cemetery goes back to 1760's or before. Our oldest readable stone is 1771. Please enjoy a leisurely walk through the graveyard. The oldest sections are near the highway, but please be very careful. Do not lean against, touch or back into these thin ancient stones that are easily broken. There are 29 Revolutionary Patriots buried here.

The single white balloons mark the grave sites of the 18 other Civil War Veterans buried at Straw. Many were Aaron's friends, only two out lived Aaron.

St. James (Straw) Lutheran Church and St. James (Straw) Lutheran Cemetery were entered on the **State and National Register of Historic Places** in 2016.
